COMMERCE	Accounting	Starting Term 2 on Monday lunchtimes.
	Economics	Starting Term 1. Week 7 Weekly tutorials on Thursday morning
ENGLISH	English	It is key to the English Department's philosophy regarding literature and literacy that our scholarship programme is essentially a 7 year process, which focusses on the study and appreciation of literature. This starts in the junior classes with courses designed to support this. We also have structured, guided reading linked to our library periods. At Years 10 and 11 we offer fortnightly book clubs as an extension to classroom literature studies. Students read a common novel, and their discussions explore narrative devices, author's purpose, writing style... These groups lead, in turn, to the Scholars' Book Club for Year 12 and 13 that, again, meets fortnightly, continuing to amass wider reading experiences. With this as its basis, students who enrol for the scholarship examination then learn literary theory, examination technique, and engage in lively, analytical discussions, which promote the original critical responses vital to NCEA Level 4 success.

PERFORMING ARTS	Drama	Scholarship for Drama is performance based. Tuition provided by Miss Eichstaedt in Term 2,

	Dance	<p>3 and 4. Starting Week 3 of Term 2 on <u>Mondays at lunchtime</u>. This will increase to include an afterschool session for the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of Term 3 and for Term 4. Start Week 4, Term 2. Portfolio based with students choreographing work, with regular checkpoints from Miss Eichstaedt. Meeting time TBC but will be weekly and ongoing for Term 2 (2<sup>nd</sup> half), Term 3 and Term 4 until due date end of October.</p>
	Media Studies	<p>Weekly tutorials start in Term 2 and will be at 7.15 Tuesday morning. Further preparation for the exam will begin in Term 3, which will involve a deeper study of media concepts and personal viewing and reading for each student. My scholarship tutorials run every Thursday after school from 3.20 to 4.00 (ish).</p>
	Music	<p>No student interest for 2019 (at this point – in May).</p>
PE	Physical Education	<p>TIC is Mrs Aitken. Students complete internal assessments on topics during the year which form a foundation for answering scholarship questions. Scholarship format is an essay, based on student research topics. Students are encouraged to attend PENZ workshops after school on dates in Terms 1- 3.</p>

	Chemistry	<p>Chemistry Scholarship is now an integrated part of the Level 3 programme of study and will run all year. Additional tutorial sessions will be held on Wednesdays afternoons, after school until 4.30pm. These additional sessions will not be every week during term 1 and will become for frequent towards the end of term 2 and start of term 3.</p>
	Physics	<p>Tutorial sessions running from mid-March on Thursdays after school with Mrs Barrett.</p>
SOCIAL SCIENCES	Classics	<p>The Classical Studies teachers will provide a suggested reading list and</p>

		readings/sources to interested students. The Classical Studies Scholarship exam uses class topics, with an additional attention on empire and power with specific focus on conquest in reference to Ancient Greece. Tutorials will begin later in Term 2.
	Geography	The Geography teachers will provide tutorials in Term 2 and 3 on Wednesday afternoons. Students should begin wider reading on the topic of "geographic location" which is the theme for the 2019 Scholarship Geography exam.
	History	Scholarship History teaching will take place during class integrated into the teaching programme. The theme for the 2019 exam is "Populism as an historical forces." <b>History Tutorials are Tuesday and Wednesday 7:15 am - 8:30am.</b>
TECHNOLOGY	Technology/DVC	The teacher will provide guidance as to what is required as students work on their folders during class. Extra support will be provided by a learning coach. Meetings at lunchtime/before/after school will be required.
VISUAL ART	Design Painting Photography	Students will be advised of after school workshops which cater to Scholarship needs. Scholarship tutorials will also run during class on elected days. Holiday sessions will also be available on a day nominated by Faculty staff in Term 3. These sessions will cater to all Visual Art students. Students need to be committed throughout the year by meeting agreed checkpoints.
	Art History	Tutorials begin in Term 2 and run once a week on a Thursday from 7.30 - 8.30am. Students need to be committed throughout the year and attend all tutorials, be prepared to do wider reading and visit current exhibitions in their own time to support course requirements.
