

Baradene College (61) Enrolment Scheme

Effective from 2020

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under section 11G (3) of the Education Act 1989 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Single Home Zone

The geographical zone is defined below and as outlined on the map attached as an Appendix ("The Home Zone").

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone <u>described below</u> and/or <u>shown on the attached</u> <u>map</u> shall be entitled to enrol at the school, subject to the priorities listed below.

Starting at the intersection of Quay Street (excluded), Tamaki Drive and The Strand head east along Tamaki Drive (Solen Street excluded). Continue around the coastline to the Pakuranga Highway (excluded). Follow the highway west and continue along the South-Eastern Highway (Carbine Road addresses 3-53, 4-60 only included) until the road reaches the Eastern railway line (Mt Wellington Highway addresses 450 and below only included. Great South Road addresses 1-1018, 2-793 only included). Follow the railway to the Manukau Harbour. Follow the coast line west to the Hugh Watt Drive Southern Western Motorway (SH20) after crossing Orpheus Drive. Follow the motorway north west (Queenstown Road addresses 44 and above only included and Hillsborough Road addresses 112 and below only included) to Hayr Road and continue north along Hayr Road (odd addresses 28-78 and below only included and Carr Road addresses 39 and below only included) to Warren Avenue (even addresses only included). Continue north along Warren Avenue to the intersection of Mt Eden Road (even addresses 436 and above only included. Mt Albert Road Addresses 539 and above only included. Landscape Road addresses 52 and below only included. Balmoral Road Addresses 55 and below only included.) and Stokes Road (Even Addresses only included). Travel east along Stokes Road to Owens Road (even addresses only included, Mountain Road excluded, Gillies Avenue odd addresses 147 and above included and even addresses 138 and above included) and then north to the end of Manukau Road (odd addresses 3-97 only excluded, Alpers Avenue, Broadway and Mahuru Street excluded), Continue along St Marks Road (even addresses only included) to Remuera Road (even addresses 2-52 and odd addresses 1-97 excluded) before travelling north east along Middleton Road (odd addresses only included. D'urville Heights, Joseph Banks Terrace, James Cook Crescent and Maui Grove excluded) to the roundabout, then continue north east along Bassett Road (even addresses 2-112 and odd addresses 3-153 only included) to the roundabout. At the roundabout (Ayr Street excluded) travel north east along Brighton Road (even addresses 2-114 only included, Kenderdine Lane excluded) to St Stephens Avenue (odd addresses 17-147 and even addresses 48-158 only included). Travel along St Stephens Avenue to Gladstone Road (odd addresses 3-87 only included, Stratford Street, Avon Street, Stanwell Street and Cleveland Road excluded) and then along Gladstone Road and then Slip Road and The Strand all the way back to the starting point.

All residential addresses on included sides of boundary roads and all no exit roads off included sides of boundary roads are included in the zones unless otherwise stated.

Priority in enrolment

Applications for enrolment outside any special programme will be processed in the following order of priority.

Priority	will be given to preference applicants for whom the school is reasonably convenient. These are preference students who reside within the approved Home Zone
	Students within this priority group are guaranteed enrolment unless including all of them would exceed the school's maximum roll (and/or school capacity). In such a situation, students will be ranked for selection according to the priorities below:
First priority*	will be given to preference applicants in the Home Zone who are siblings of current students
Second priority	will be given to preference applicants in the Home Zone who are siblings of former students
Third priority	will be given to preference applicants in the Home Zone who are daughters/granddaughters of alumnae
Fourth priority	will be given to preference applicants in the Home Zone who are daughters of teaching staff
Fifth priority	will be given to preference applicants in the Home Zone (not in the above priorities)

Out of Zone Applicants

Sixth priority	will be given to preference applicants out of zone who are siblings of current students	
Seventh priority	will be given to preference applicants out of zone that are siblings of former students	
Eighth priority	will be given to preference applicants out of zone who are daughters/granddaughters of alumnae	
Ninth priority	will be given to preference applicants out of zone who are daughters of teaching staff	
Tenth priority	will be given to preference applicants out of zone (not in priorities 6-9)	
Non Preference Applicants		

Eleventh priority	will be given to non preference applicants in the Home Zone
Twelfth Priority	will be given to non preference applicants out of zone

If there are more applicants in the priority groups than there are places available, places will be allocated in priority order until a category is reached where the number of spaces available in that category is insufficient to accommodate the number of eligible students. Places will be allocated by ballot. **Grandparented arrangement* -** until the end of 2026 siblings of current students at the College at the time of the adoption of this new scheme and who reside out of Zone will also be entitled to enrolment as First Priority.

Waiting List Procedure

If the total number of applications is greater than the number of places available, unsuccessful applicants will have their names recorded on a waiting list, within the relevant priority category, ranked according to the priorities. Students on the waiting list may be offered places at a later date if places become available. The waiting list will remain current until the beginning of the following College year.

Siblings at the same year level will be kept together for the purpose of the ballot, so that if one sibling's name is drawn, the other(s) is/are automatically successful also.

Notes:

- Applicants seeking priority status on the basis of a sibling relationship may be required to provide proof of a sibling relationship.
- Applicants seeking priority status on the basis of an in Zone address may be required to provide proof of their residence at the address and that the address has not been used as a temporary residence for the purpose of gaining enrolment at the College.
- The number of places available for non-preference students will be governed by the maximum number allowable under the College's Integration Agreement.

Enrolment Applications

The closing date for applications for the following year along with the proper procedures for applying will be published in the main daily newspaper (currently the NZ Herald), and on the College website.
