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

It is a privilege to step into the role of Principal at Baradene College. This year, we commemorate the 100th anniversary of the canonisation of Saint Madeleine Sophie Barat RSCJ, founder of the Society of the Sacred Heart. Canonised on 24 May 1925, her vision and dedication to education continue to influence our mission at Baradene College. Her vision – one that prioritises academic excellence, service, and personal growth – remains just as relevant for our students in 2025.

Honouring the impact of our RSCJ Sisters and the Society of the Sacred Heart, and in light of the 100th anniversary of Saint Madeleine Sophie's canonisation, this year Baradene's Giving Week will raise funds for our inaugural Sister Elizabeth Snedden Scholarship (as part of a new RSCJ Scholarship Fund). A year of faith

In 2025, we also observe the Catholic Church's Jubilee Year, a tradition held every 25 years, offering a special time for forgiveness and reconciliation. Pope Francis has designated the theme for the 2025 Jubilee as "Pilgrims of Hope", emphasising our collective journey of faith and the importance of hope in navigating life's challenges. One symbol of a Jubilee Year is a Holy Door, an entrance to a sacred space. In a similar way, the front doors of Duchesne stand as a symbolic gateway, marking the beginning of each student's journey at Baradene.

A symbol of tradition

For more than a century, the stairs leading up to Duchesne have served as the entrance to the school, both literally and symbolically. Every student, visitor, and staff member

These stairs have witnessed countless moments in Baradene's history. Generations of students have gathered on them for class photos, alumnae have returned to capture wedding portraits, and distinguished visitors have stood upon them, marking key milestones. This issue's "Years on the Stairs" theme reflects the enduring legacy of Baradene and the shared experiences of those who have passed through its doors. The photos being showcased capture more than just memorable moments – they tell the story of a school that has continually grown while remaining deeply rooted in its values.

Celebrating success

We continue to foster a strong sense of belonging for every student. When students feel valued and supported, they thrive. This is reflected in our latest academic results, with 98.2% of students achieving University Entrance. Our NCEA Level 2 pass rate is an impressive 99.4%. These results are a testament not only to the dedication of our students but also to the commitment of our staff, who work tirelessly to create a learning environment that challenges and supports every student.

Living our values

At the start of each year, all staff attend a Focus Goal Day to learn how we can bring our school's values to life. This year's Focus Goal, "A Social Awareness That Impels to Action", encourages us to reflect on how faith can be lived out in meaningful and impactful ways. Guest speaker John Mooney spoke about the importance of turning intention into action, and staff across different departments participated in activities that directly contributed to the community, such as preparing meals and creating resources for those in need. These opportunities reinforce the values we seek to instil in our students: Compassion, service, and a commitment to making a difference.

Looking ahead

As we move through 2025, my aim is on ensuring that Baradene continues to provide the best possible opportunities for our students – academically, spiritually, and personally. I look forward to working alongside staff, students, and families and continuing our legacy of educating and empowering confident young women.

Rachel Vaughan, our new Head of Mathematics, tells us about her adventures in numberland.

I am excited to bring 25 years of teaching experience to Baradene, and inspire both students and staff as Head of Mathematics, fostering a culture of excellence and achievement. With a deep passion for mathematics education, I hope to create an environment where every student is challenged, engaged, and empowered to reach their full potential.

Some people express themselves in words, others in pictures, but I am a numbers girl through and through. I have always been fascinated by mathematics - the worlds numbers can create and the stories they can tell. My father, who passed away nine years ago, ignited my love for maths. As an engineer, he understood the importance of the discipline. While I am not an engineer myself, I am passionate about encouraging more women to pursue careers in engineering. My dad was incredibly supportive, although we clashed when it came to maths homework – my teacher would get me to solve a problem one way, and he would tell me another. That friction was helpful, because it made me realise that while maths is a world of rules, it's also an incredible source of creativity. My father introduced me to maths, but it's my mother I owe for shaping me into the teacher I am today. She's incredibly calm and nurturing, and is a pillar of strength. When I'm in the classroom, I strive to emulate her qualities.

My adventures in numberland have taken me from Canterbury, where I completed my degree in teaching; to London, where

I was a teacher and Dean at a leading independent coeducational school Latymer Upper; to Sydney, where I worked at Redlands College; and then back to New Zealand. In 2023, I became Kāhui Ako for Mathematics, working with Baradene and our Catholic feeder primary schools, advising and supporting teachers and students. From our Faculty

In 2025, the Mathematics Faculty is proud to provide an array of enriching opportunities for our students, including a weekly Mathematics clinic offered on Wednesdays for students needing extra support with their classwork. Here is a recap of some of our 2024 highlights:

- New Zealand Mathematics Olympiad Competition: Six students entered Round 1, with two progressing to Round 2 (the National final).
- Australian Mathematics Competition (AMC):
 76 students participated with 73 students receiving an award.
- Mathematics and Statistics Research Competition: Six students participated.





- Mathex Competition: Involved teams from Years 7 to 10, with our Year 8 team scoring 95 (out of 100).
- Otago Problem Challenge: 24 of our Year 7 and 8 students participated.
- Scholarship Success: In 2024, five students received the Statistics Scholarship, and four students received the Calculus Scholarship.

Focus on faith



Our Director of Mission, Catherine Everitt, provides insight into the significance of this Jubilee Year in the Catholic Church.

Biblically, the Jubilee every 50 years is a time of renewal, celebration, rest and freedom. In Old Testament times, debts were cancelled, prisoners and enslaved people were freed, and even the land was able to rest.

Pope Francis has called this Jubilee Year "Pilgrims of Hope" – "Te Hunga Hikoi i roto i te Tumanako". It is an invitation to renew our hope, a hope which comes from knowing that God loves each one of us, whoever we are. The Pope has asked us to be signs of hope for others, by putting Catholic social teaching into action through caring for our common home and supporting our sisters and brothers who are experiencing war, hunger, exclusion, or poverty.

A symbol of a Jubilee Year is often a Holy Door. These doors are entrances into sacred spaces, and in this Jubilee Year, when our focus will be hope, may we consider that every time we open a door, behind it, there is an opportunity to help someone in need and share God's love. On 24 December 2024, Pope Francis opened the Holy Door of Saint Peter's Basilica, officially inaugurating the 2025 Jubilee of Hope.



Doors of Hope: Making a new beginning, growing, caring for others, caring for myself... These are themes our students worked with for their Homeroom Doors of Hope special project. Is there one way you will do something kind, thoughtful, or generous, to bring hope to others during the Year of Jubilee? How will you care for yourself this year? With these choices, you are a Pilgrim of Hope.

The official mascot for the 2025 Jubilee Year is Luce, a name which is Italian for "light".

Luce wears a yellow raincoat, mud-stained boots, and a pilgrim's cross. Her task is to guide pilgrims toward hope and faith.

Shells glimmer in Luce's eyes, recalling the scallop shell of the Camino de Santiago, an emblem of the pilgrimage journey that serve as "a symbol of the hope of the heart".

Luce's yellow sailor's raincoat is a nod to both the Vatican flag and to journeying through life's storms. The mascot's muddy boots represent a long and, at times, messy journey, while her staff symbolises the pilgrimage with God.





From its first International students in the 1990s to today, Baradene has built a supportive, inclusive environment that helps students thrive far from home.

In its early years, Baradene primarily served domestic students, but its commitment to academic excellence and spiritual development soon attracted attention beyond New Zealand. The first International students arrived in the mid-1990s, and in 1998, an ESOL Teacher/Homestay Coordinator was hired to support their integration into Baradene.

As the global demand for international education grew, in 2001, Felicity Lister (our current Enrolments Officer), was employed to manage the growing number of International enrolments and homestay placements. Over the years, Baradene has welcomed students from many countries, including China, Hong Kong, Singapore, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Thailand, Vietnam, Germany, USA, Mexico, and Brazil.

Recognising the challenges International students face when studying at a new school, in a foreign country and away from their usual support network, Baradene has always prioritised comprehensive support. This support is in line with New Zealand's pioneering Code of Practice for International Students introduced in 2002, with recent updates that have expanded the Code's reach and strengthened its focus on well-being.

This focus on wellbeing led to the establishment of the International Student Dean role in 2008, offering pastoral care to our International students. Today, Belinda Sydenham, Head of ESOL and International Student Dean, continues this legacy, providing academic and pastoral support. Additional support is provided by our Mandarin-speaking counsellor.

We also have a dedicated and experienced Homestay Co-ordinator, Dianne Storer, who ensures we provide high-quality homestay accommodation to our students. Under the leadership of Alexandra Russell, Principal and International Student Director, supported by Kate Meredith, International Student Manager, the International Student Department is committed to ensuring that students receive care and guidance. Over the years, this dedication to fostering a diverse, inclusive environment has enriched our community, preparing all our students for success in a globalised world, with opportunities for tertiary education in New Zealand and overseas.

Nearls Stairs

Baradene's Archivist, Yolande van de Wetering, shares some of the countless photos taken over the years on the stairs of Duchesne.

In 1909, the Society of the Sacred Heart bought a 24-acre property on the corner of Victoria Avenue and Shore Road, Remuera, from Edwin Mitchelson, a prominent businessman who was Mayor of Auckland from 1903 to 1905.

The RSCJ Sisters needed a big piece of land for their new Auckland school. The old house on site was much too small to house the students as well as the Sisters, so they engaged Thomas Mahoney, a well-known Auckland architect, to design a new school building with boarding facilities. His design of an impressive four-storey building in "European" style was accepted, and in 1909 the building project started, and was completed in 1910. In 1991, this iconic building was named Duchesne, after Saint Philippine Duchesne RSCJ.

The facade of Duchesne is striking, with its spire, portico, and wide central staircase. The roof tiles were imported from Marseilles, France. Originally, the walls were not painted, but after the earthquake-strengthening project in 1991, they were painted today's iconic soft apricot colour.

Duchesne's staircase has played and still plays an important role in many events, processions, visits by dignitaries and other well-known guests, photo shoots, and serves as a launching pad for the annual lolly scramble!



GROWING CHAMBER MUSIC PROGRAMME

Baradene's musicians are thriving, with new ensembles forming and flourishing.

Our Chamber Music Programme is in a healthy position, with the emergence of a number of new ensembles over the last year, including the Trombone Quartet, a Flute Trio, and several groups featuring string instruments. Two other ensembles include the Clarinet Ensemble and Saxophone Quartet, which were originally combined as the Clariphones and performed in 2024 at the Spring Music Festival and end-of-year assemblies.



This year, due to the growing number of music students with the ability to perform in small ensembles showcasing their instruments, the groups' music director,

Mr Mark Hobson, has been able to separate the clarinets and saxophones into two groups. This exposes the students to new experiences, allowing them to become more responsible for their own parts while improving their ensemble skills; this in turn lifts the quality of our large music groups as the students in the smaller ensembles transfer their improved skills to their sections in the Senior Concert Band or Combined Orchestra. The Clarinet Ensemble consists of eight members playing both alto and bass clarinets.



They are currently rehearsing an exciting new repertoire in a range of styles, from jazz to classical pieces arranged for a small group (they are working on two pieces by Clare Grundman, Caprice and Bagatelle); the Ensemble's goal is to perform at the New Zealand Chamber Music Competition in June and at several school events this year.



The Baradene Friends of Music has shown their support for our growing Chamber Music Programme with the recent donation of a brand-new bass clarinet





Stuart, was a Trustee between 1863 and 1877. One of the houses at Oakham is Stuart House, named after Janet's family. My visit there reinforced the crucial role of school libraries in fostering literacy, critical thinking, and student well-being. Engaging directly with school librarians, literacy advocates, and educational leaders, sharing and learning innovative strategies to integrate libraries into the wider learning experience was an incredible opportunity. I will apply the insights and experiences gained to enhance library services at Baradene College. My research reaffirms that a well-supported school library empowers students with the skills and resources they need to thrive in school and beyond, nurturing informed, engaged, and curious lifelong learners."

Baradene's Makerspace continues to be an important resource for the school by offering a wide range of specialist services, tools, and knowledge to all students. This support comes in the form of class bookings, curriculum-aligned practical units, and virtual reality-based learning. Students also come in their own time to do 3D printing for robotics, make props for cultural groups, and create custom-designed gifts for their family members. We incorporate the latest digital processes to ensure all our students apply real-world problem-solving skills and innovation.

Makerspace is a very popular facility, producing high volumes, and the numbers speak for themselves each year:

These numbers show how much Baradene students embrace and love technology.

This year, we are excited to add a new UV ink printer to supplement everyone's favourite machine, the laser cutter. A UV ink printer has the capability to print on any flat surface

in full colour and with varying levels of varnish. Students will be able to print designs onto panels before laser cutting, to give their assembled piece a professional finish.

We are so grateful to have Makerspace, an amazing and future-focussed resource that was made possible thanks to the generosity of the Baradene community. Fundraising efforts from the 2022 Giving Week run by Growing Heart allowed the College to purchase the specialised equipment and technology needed to bring Makerspace to life.

Our team of student volunteers (Makerspace Guardians) continue to assist their peers from all year levels. Each day is different, and we're always looking at ways to innovate and reach new heights of success. Last year, Isabella White (now in Year 13) gained a Scholarship in Computer Science with a digital tangram puzzle that was made exclusively in the Makerspace. We look forward to what the future holds.

Fran Jonas


- Spin Bowler who was selected into the White Ferns when she was in Year 13 at Baradene.



WRITING THE JOURNEY

For Erika Barden (née Just, Class of 1991), adventure has always been part of the journey.

From navigating Baradene's busy campus to walking the 780km Camino de Santiago – twice – Erika Barden has never been one to shy away from a challenge. Her latest adventure? Turning her family's pilgrimage into a book, *A Kiwi Camino*, a warm, personal account of their experience.

Erika arrived at Baradene in Third Form and it didn't take long for her to find her place. She threw herself into sports, debating, and student leadership, making lifelong friends along the way. "Baradene was a massive influence on me," she says. "The Bara girls became my family, and even though I hadn't seen many of them for years, a lovely crew of Baradene alumnae turned up in support when my dad died suddenly about a decade ago."







That connection continues – her daughter Malaika is in Year 12, making Erika part of the next generation of Baradene mums with daughters here. "I always wanted my daughter to go to Baradene," she says. "It's such a special community and offers so many opportunities. I'm thrilled she loves it too."

After leaving Baradene in 1991, Erika studied a conjoint BCom/BA at the University of Auckland. Then came the overseas chapter: America, England, Ireland, and meeting a fellow Kiwi, Seamus, who by chance had gone to Sacred Heart College. They returned to New Zealand, marrying at St Patrick's Cathedral and settling in Orakei, where they now raise their three children. In 2017, Erika received her Master of Advanced Leadership Practice, with Distinction, from Massey University.

Her professional life is as varied as her travels. Erika is the Managing Director of niche management consultancy Frank Innovation & Transformation, co-founded an olive oil business, co-owns a dairy farm in Southland, is partner in a butchery, and chairs Te Korowai o Waiheke, a community trust aiming to make Waiheke Island the world's first predator-free urban island.

But it's the Camino de Santiago that holds a special place in her heart. She and Seamus first walked the route in 2004, when they were engaged. "Walking 780km gives you a lot of time to talk and think," Erika recalls. "It helped us really get to know each other and ourselves." Their experience was so meaningful, they agreed that if they were blessed with children, they would return with them one day.

Nearly 20 years later, in 2023, the Barden family set off on their Camino, walking for 34 days from France across Spain. "Our kids were 11, 13, and 15 at the time, old enough to carry their own packs but still young enough to want to travel with their parents," she smiles.

What started as a personal keepsake of their trip became *A Kiwi Camino*, a book filled with the highs, lows, and lessons from their journey. "There's never a perfect time to walk the Camino, write a book, or tick something off your bucket list," she says. "If you genuinely want to do something, you need to hold tight to your dream, draft a plan, and take the first step. That first step could be the start of something incredibly special."

Beyond the physical challenge, the experience was about determination, resilience, and gratitude. "When you pare life back to what's really important, it's family, health, food, fun, a good night's sleep – and, on the Camino, sturdy footwear!"

The Barden family is already talking about their next adventure – maybe the Portuguese Way this time. "The Camino reignited our awareness and appreciation for life's simple pleasures," Erika says.
